

## MEN, WOMEN & CHILDREN WHO ARRIVED AT MANTI, NOVEMBER 1849

Early records indicate the first company to the Sanpete valley consisted of 224 individuals. Obviously, this list does not give the names of all those who made the journey to establish the initial settlement. Perhaps future research will enable the addition of names of those pioneers not included here.
